First issue I will tackle	Working on jobs and improving our economy. Because a good paying job answers a lot of question like: access to food, housing and health care.
How I will impact	
Education	By giving school districts the freedom to allocate education funding according to unique needs and circumstances. Require schools to post budgets and other public documents online.
Economy	By suggesting strategies for promoting economic growth in both the short term and the long term that includes: • Keeping overall tax and regulatory burdens as low. • Spending more tax dollars on public safety and the courts. • Increasing the productivity of current taxpayer spending on infrastructure and education programs that work.
Government budget	While in 2013 the legislature made some strides in reforming the tax code and cutting the overall tax burden for some, there is still more to be done. The state's tax system still penalizes working families and small businesses. Medicaid and the health care system are also in need of major reform. But a great deal still needs to be accomplished, particularly in the areas of tax reform,





	coal ash, and the Charlotte airport.
Children and youth	As childhood obesity rates continue to rise, the debate over the National School Lunch Program and the sale of junk food in and around public schools has intensified. I will work with elected officials on efforts to promote healthy lifestyles, research suggests that quality programs can make children healthier.
Community health/safety	One year ago, Gov. Pat McCrory proposed a Medicaid reform that would have statewide managed care organizations (MCOs) compete to provide health care services to North Carolina's Medicaid patients. Each patient would be risk-adjusted for individual health status. These MCOs would be awarded fixed contracts from the state to have providers deliver care and would bear full risk in the event of cost overruns. Taxpayers would only be on the hook for Medicaid enrollment fluctuations. MCOs would be responsible for all Medicaid populations, coordinating both mental and physical health care needs. I will work with the current leadership for better health out comes and reforms.
Community growth/quality of life	Most studies find that lower levels of taxes and spending, less-intrusive regulation, and lower energy prices correlate with stronger economic growth. Most studies also find that the quantity and quality of infrastructure and the level of educational attainment are linked to economic growth.
Most important role of government	I believe that the proper role of government is to do for the people those things that need to be done but cannot be done, or cannot be done as well by individuals, and that the most effective government is closest to the people.
Way candidate will help leaders to collaborate	By working with local elected officials to address a still-sluggish economy with high unemployment and under employment.
